Lanyon High School Strategic Plan 2018 – 2021

Our strategic plan continues to focus on two major priorities;

1. Improve reading, writing and numeracy
2. Ensure all students have pathways to success

This semester staff are focusing on improving their skills in teaching writing for each of their different subjects or disciplines. The types of writing could include composing a persuasive letter, such as an opinion piece relating to healthy eating. Another example includes writing reflections on pieces of art or music. Each teacher is collecting information about their students' skills and implementing new teaching strategies to best meet the needs of students and to track their progress as they improve.

The Pastoral Care (PC) program is an important aspect of developing students strategies for self-management, self-direction and wellbeing to ensure students are equipped for future success. The Pastoral Care Team spent a lot of time in 2019 reviewing this curriculum in order to align it to the Personal and Social Capability of the Australian Curriculum. It is expected that the various units studied in the PC program can be flexible and responsive as needs and issues arise or change for different year groups or groups of students. Topics can include

DANCE AND PERFORMING ARTS

The Senior Performing Arts class is off to a great start this term as they prepare to create their own musical! The students have already demonstrated their skills in musical theatre this term by creating an entertaining whole class routine to 'It's Not Unusual' by Tom Jones. Students are beginning to analyse musical theatre and consider the dramatic and dance skills needed to tell stories through music, dance and acting.

STREET ART - ENRICHMENT

Last week in the Street Art enrichment class students looked at different forms of Street Art. The question for the session was Vandalism or Art? Students were exposed through viewing traditional Street Art, Pop Art and Anime. From here students started to plan their design choices. We look forward to making a start on our pieces of art work this week.



MUSIC

In class the students have been creating and responding to music. All units comprise of a range of opportunities for students to engage in music whether that be performing, composing or critiquing. Although we are only in Week 4 it has been incredibly exciting to see the creativity that students are bringing to their learning!



Year 7 Music students have been developing their understanding of beat and rhythm through theory activities, bucket drumming, as well as using technology to create drumbeats online. We will be continuing to develop their understanding of music notation, as well as composing soundscapes later in the term. In Year 8 our focus has been on ukulele this week, where students worked on mashups using 4 common chords. In the coming weeks they will work towards creating recordings of song covers using software to mix their tracks. Senior Music students have begun working on their major songwriting project for the semester where they will write and record an original song. They will also be preparing a review of a song/album, as well as honing their practice and performance skills by working towards their major end of semester performance piece.



DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

The Senior Digital Technology class has been learning the nuts and bolt of programming. They have been working with Processing Java Script to dcfvcreate small programs that users can interact with. This week we have started creating a mini game incorporating all the skill they have learnt so far. It should be interesting to see the end result.

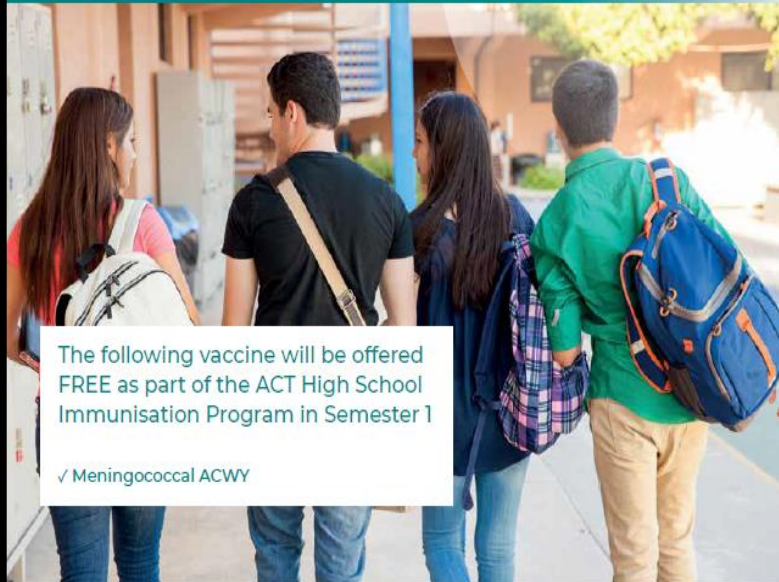

As we start a new school year, we would like to remind you, parents and students about our services and how to best prepare for travel on both bus and light rail in the new year. Details of all school and regular services are available [online](#) for parents and students to begin planning their journeys.

School routes and services remain unchanged for 2020. Transport Canberra is here to support the safe passage of students to and from school using public transport and active travel options.

To assist in planning school bus travel, use our handy tips and checklist below.

Routes and timetables:

Check the details of services required for your child to and from school, also making sure your child is familiar with the times and stops. If your child is new to school or changing schools, please check available [school services](#) or [regular bus timetables](#) information.

Journey Planner:

The Transport Canberra Journey Planner includes school services, allowing you to plan out the most convenient mode of transport for your trip to school. Use Transport Canberra's [journey planner](#) to plan your travel, and use [NXTBUS](#) to track your awaited service.

MyWay cards:

MyWay is the cheapest and easiest way to travel with Transport Canberra services. A student [MyWay card](#) can be purchased online, over the phone, or at a MyWay Recharge Agent. Adding travel credit is even easier with the options of B-Pay or Autoload direct debit, attracting an additional 5% discount on all fares. Students can also top up their MyWay card or purchase a single or daily ticket at Transport Canberra's new [ticket vending machines](#), available at selected bus stations and Light Rail stops.
