From the principal

Events and successes

I've been enjoying visiting classrooms to observe students and teachers in the learning process. In wood technology I've seen student making hutches for animals in preparation for sale at LanFest. I've also been impressed by students analysing poetry to see how words can influence people's thoughts and feelings. A big highlight was Book Week and this was my first time at the school celebrate the power of literature to shape our culture. It was a great day and I was particularly proud of the staff who chose to participate in this event. For year 10 this is a particularly busy time as they make decisions about college in

New timetable in 2019

In 2019 the school will be operating to a new timetable. This decision has been made to complete our process of compliance with the Australian Curriculum and also to incorporate an 'Enrichment' lesson in order to value the skills and learning that enhance the Australian Curriculum;

What's the same?

- School starting and finishing times
- Recess and lunch breaks times
- The inclusion of a Pastoral Care lesson each week
- The range of arts, technology and other electives offered to students
- Year 7 and 8 students will study Japanese, as per federal government requirements

What's different?

- All students will study a full year of the five core subjects; English, mathematics, science, humanities and social sciences and health & physical education
- Some lesson lengths will be different with a mixture of 40, 60 and 80-minute lesson lengths
- A 1 hour per week 'Enrichment' class will be introduced

The Enrichment class will have a mixtures of year groups and students will have several options from which to choose. Students studying ASBAs and VLOs may choose to use this time to catch up missed work with the support of a teacher. Some clubs and externally run programs such as Band, DanceFest, Dance Nation and Drama club will occur during this time slot. Teachers will offer courses that relate to their personal interested such as; automotive, upcycling clothes, horticulture and STEM club. More details about this timetable will be provided to students and parents/carers over the coming months.

Parent-Teacher Interviews

A reminder that mid semester reports will be emailed on **Monday 10 September**. Please remember that parent-teacher interviews will be held on **Wednesday 19 September from 4.00pm-7.00pm**. Details of how to make appointments will be included in the report. I encourage you to attend this night to get feedback on your child's progress and to discuss any areas of concerns and strategies to provide support both at home and at school.

Year 7

We are now past the midpoint of term 3 and Year 7 will have completed many units of study across their subjects. Mid semester progress reports will be sent out in coming weeks with information on parent-teacher interviews to follow. E- grade warnings have been sent out and if your student received one, their teacher will work with them on an improvement plan. Google Classroom is utilised at Lanyon High School and is a great way to keep track of what is happening in your student's classes. In Science students are learning about renewable and non-renewable resources. Angles has been the focus in Mathematics. Growth and development is the theoretical topic and a rotation of Ultimate Frisbee, hockey, and soccer have been commenced in Health and Physical Education. Geography and liveability is the focus in HASS.

All subjects across the school are now using these Chromebooks in one way or another so it is important for your student's learning that they are consistent in their management of their device.

Assertive Communication

One area that Pastoral Care Teachers have been educating students about is how to communicate in an assertive matter. Being assertive means that you express yourself effectively and stand up for your point of view. In doing this you also respect the rights and beliefs of others. Passive and aggressive communication styles are commonly linked to victim and bully behaviours which can affect mental and social wellbeing.

Assertive communication enables our students to talk through issues and potentially find common ground. It also assists them to come to amicable agreements during conflict. Students can practice assertive communication by using 'I' statements. Instead of "you're wrong" you could say "I disagree because..." "You're annoying" becomes "I don't like it when you ..."

Assertive communication should use confident body language that is neither threatening or sullen.

Through practising these techniques, our students will develop better communication skills, have better empathy for others, and build better relationships with others. Using these skills at school and reinforced at home will instil these techniques in our students, leading to greater opportunities in social settings later in life.

on exchange from Germany. She has now returned to Germany but has left many lasting memories and friends.






Uniform

Please find below a schedule of changes to school bus service route numbers for services which operate to and from your school which will come into effect from Monday 3rd September 2018.
