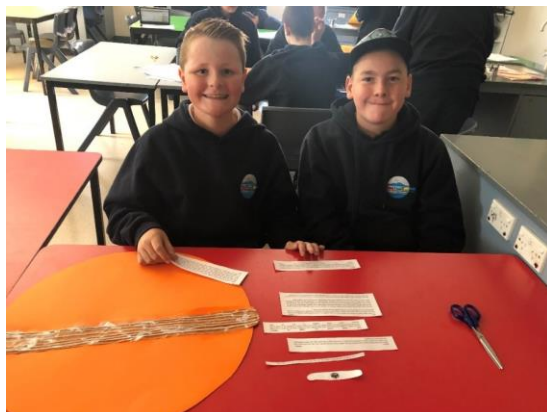

Participation was high and the day was a very enjoyable event for the Lanyon High School community, with everyone being very supportive and encouraging. Johnny will be providing students with a deeper understanding around a range of topics including healthy and unhealthy relationships, communication and the legal aspects involved.

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## Year 10

### College Enrolments



If you have not enrolled your child into a college yet it is very important that you do so as soon as possible. The processes to begin students transitioning to college are beginning, such as helping students select courses through interviews with college staff.

In the ACT a child is of compulsory participation age until the child completes Year 12 or turns 17, whichever happens first. Students who are uncertain about attending college are required to enrol in college. Students in this position would be able to withdraw their college enrolment when an alternate plan for further training or employment has been finalised. Students wishing to make alternate plans are advised to consult a Career Practitioner teacher.

Please contact the school if you need assistance with the college enrolment process or would like to discuss helping your child find their pathway to success after high school.

### Melbourne Trip

The Melbourne Trip notes will be coming out this week (Week 4) and the cost has been confirmed at \$800. Please ensure you pay the full amount well in advance and ensure you contact the school early if you have concerns about this.

Please ensure medical and dietary requirements on the permission note are accurate and if they change prior to the trip please contact me to ensure they can be updated effectively.

I will be meeting with students attending camp later in the term to provide them with more details as needed.



### Rotary Interviews



In Pastoral Care this term students are preparing to participate in Rotary Interviews, in which they attend a mock interview with a volunteer from the Rotary Club. Students have been working on a resume and cover letter, which they will submit as part of their "job application."

Students' interviews will be held on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> September after school from

4-7pm. We hope and expect for all year 10 students to participate in this and attend their interview, as it is a valuable way to put into practise the life-long skills they are learning in Pastoral Care and will be a useful way to develop their interview and job application skills in a time when many of them will start looking for employment.

We are now in the process of organising and preparing the details for the Year 10 Formal. It is on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December. Typically, the cost is somewhere between \$100-130 and we will be able to provide more information once everything is booked.

## Maths News

In year 7 Mathematics, students have been studying measurement and started off by looking at units of length. In an activity on problem solving and estimation, students used the heights of cups to estimate the height of various objects, including the height of their teachers Ms Broadbent and Mr Fryz! Students have moved on and are now looking at perimeter and the area of rectangles and are working towards an assessment task next week.



Students in all classes are working on various Mathspace activities organised by their teachers using their Chromebooks in school and for homework. Lanyon High has purchased the licence for this online maths program and students are benefitting from the hints and tutorial videos in addition to their classroom teacher to work toward finding solutions to problems.

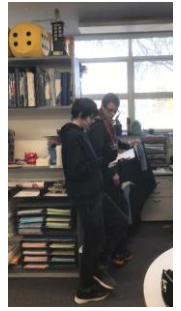


Students in Year 10 using Mathspace to work on solving linear equations and inequalities to develop and consolidate skills.

They participated in an art workshop with the gallery staff, which allowed them to learn about some of the amazing works of art in the gallery. Students also participated in a workshop with local Canberra poet Jacqui Malins. Jacqui shared some of her poetry with the students and then led the students through some of the works at the gallery, using the art to help students write their own poetry. Finally the students used a treasured object of their own to inspire a piece of poetry. The poetry workshop was facilitated by the Red Room Poetry company, who work to promote poetry in schools and the community. In between workshops the students enjoyed lunch in the gallery's sculpture garden.
