# Action Bus Changes For Term 1 2023

Improvements to the Transport Canberra bus network and timetable will be implemented **from Monday 30**January 2023 (aligning with the start of the school term). This includes refinements to several school services based on school and community feedback. These improvements ensure reliable services across the network which take into account construction associated with raising London Circuit in the city, the temporary Woden bus interchange and ongoing construction in the Woden town centre. Light rail is continuing to run to a normal frequency.

# **Transport Canberra School Packs and Timetables**

Updated school packs and timetables are now available online to view and download. If your child is catching the bus to school, we recommend familiarising them with their school route so they know which stop the bus will pick them up from in the morning and where to get off at the end of the day.

# **WEX**

Congratulations to all students that have completed a WEX (Work Experience) placement in 2022. It has been a successful year with most Year 10 students and a large number of Year 9 students completing work experience placements.

As training and education continue to change and adapt to the needs of the dynamic world of work, WEX is an opportunity to assist young people to prepare them for transition into the next phase of their lives. WEX includes a focus on the provision of cohesive links between school, employers, training providers, the community, and other stakeholders to ensure that young people have access to quality education services and transition support.

In recognition of the need to link schools and the world of work; WEX, work placements and other vocational learning opportunities have expanded to enable all students to integrate their school studies with the world of work. Students 14 years and over are eligible to participate in workplace learning programs. Consideration will be given to their career readiness in terms of their vocational development and their social and emotional maturity.

Prior to any workplace learning participation all students must receive a face-to-face Work Health and Safety (WHS) briefing, including information regarding their rights and responsibilities. WHS information in schools can be delivered by teachers, training providers or relevant industry guest speakers. Unions ACT and affiliates will present WHS information sessions free of charge to schools. These WHS information sessions are endorsed by the ACT Work Safety Council.

# **VLO**

Congratulations to all students that participated in a VLO this year! The feedback received from trainers is a credit to all students - very task oriented, participated extremely well and showed quite high levels of skills given such early stages in vocational training.

# **ASBA**

Australian School-based Apprenticeships (ASBA) offer students the opportunity to achieve a nationally recognised vocational qualification by combining paid work and training as part of their education program. I would like to congratulate all students that secured an ASBA in 2022 and wish you all the best in experiencing success at your workplace and training in school education.

# Young Workers Unions ACT Presentation

Year 9 and 10 students are invited to attend the Young Workers Union ACT 'Work Health and Safety (WHS) Information' presentation on the 6<sup>th of</sup> February 2023. This will be a presentation delivered in Pastoral Care Lines. Guest speakers are from Unions ACT. WHS information sessions are endorsed by ACT Work Safety Council. Briefings standardise the WHS information given to all students and ensure relevance and accuracy in the information is maintained. Presentation topics include health and safety, rights, responsibilities, leave and agreements in the workplace.

Please note: this activity is compulsory for any student that wishes to participate in structured workplace learning, Work Experience (WEX), Vocational Learning Options (VLO) or Australian School Based Apprenticeship placement (ASBA).

White Card and Asbestos Awareness Training Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> March & Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2023 2023 students in Years 9 & 10 who are interested in completing the General Construction Induction (White Card) and Asbestos Awareness Training will have the opportunity to do so next year.

These qualifications are mandatory requirements for students to gain any work experience or employment in the construction and building industry. Lanyon High School has secured a trainer from the Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT) to run both courses at Lanyon High. CIT have limited places on offer, so it will be prioritised to those who return their permission notes along with payment to secure a place.

To enrol in the White Card and Asbestos Training Course students will need to see LHS careers advisor Glenda Johnson to receive a permission note and provide personal details, plus identification. The permission note and payment slip will need to be returned to Lanyon Highschool Front Office no later than the 6<sup>th of</sup> March 2023

Students will also need to provide:

- a USI number (Unique Student Identifier number) please log onto <u>www.usi.gov.au</u> to get one or contact Glenda for help. Please do not submit your permission form without it.
- 3 forms of ID required- ID is Medicare card, passport/birth certificate and Proof of Age cards or School ID (copy needs to be provided)
- CIT requires 100 points of identification. Our school administration will be verifying both the identity and citizenship of your child.

CIT Staff will then admit the students into their chosen course of study. Each student will be sent a confirmation of their application, which will include their CIT Number, Class Reference Numbers (CRNs) and a step-by-step process of how to **complete** their enrolment online through CIT Self Service.

# YWCA Canberra Clubhouse overview

YWCA'S Canberra Clubhouse is a free, out of school learning space that provides young people, aged 10 to 18 in the Tuggeranong region, with access to the latest technology, as well as mentoring and support to grow their skills in science, technology, engineering, arts, mathematics, and music (STEAMM). With the essential support from our cross-sector partners, volunteers, Tuggeranong community, and our dedicated staff, members can thrive in a supportive environment that fosters their creativity and learning in areas such as coding, 3D printing, photography, film making, textiles, game design, web design, tactile and digital art, electronics, music production, and more. At the Clubhouse, members will engage in long-term projects in collaboration with other members and with the support from a dedicated Clubhouse staff member.

# Application and membership

To ensure the Clubhouse is delivering a high quality program that aligns with the Clubhouse Network Learning Model, prospective members must complete an application to become a member. Applicants can request to attend one of the two days available with a limited number of places available. Membership to the Clubhouse will now be on a term-by-term basis, meaning an application for membership will need to be submitted each term. Applications will be assessed on their suitability for this program based on the Learning Model, interest in STEAMM, and prior engagement in the Clubhouse program. Priority will be given to young people who live or attend school in the Tuggeranong region. Equitable access is important to us, we will do our best to accommodate all eligible young people. Applicants will be contacted in the last week of the school holidays with the outcome of their application and successful applicants will need to complete a more comprehensive membership form to give additional information and to provide consent. If a place is not able to be offered, the young person will placed on a waiting list and contacted if a place becomes available.

# Structure

The Clubhouse will be structured as follows:

- Mondays will be dedicated to projects focused on engineering and technology
- Wednesdays will be dedicated to projects focused on art and music

The following is what members can expect in a typical afternoon at the Clubhouse:

- 3:00pm afternoon tea (fruit and filling snacks)
- 3:15pm circle time for group bonding, announcements, and project brainstorming/updates
- 3:30pm working on projects
- . 5:00pm working on projects with gaming and free play also permitted
- 6:00pm Clubhouse closes

# Clubhouse

YWCA Canberra's Clubhouse is a free, out of school learning space for young people, aged 10 to 18 in the Tuggeranong region to grow their skills in science, technology, engineering, arts, mathematics, and music. At the Clubhouse, members can explore areas such as coding, electronics, 3D printing, photography, videography, green screen effects, arts and craft, textiles, music, and more. Membership at the Richardson location is on an application basis. The application form can be accessed here.

# A-Z

A-Z is a free social support group for gender and sexuality diverse young people and allies aged 12 to 25. Young people can learn about opportunities in the community, hear from LGBTQIA+ leaders, meet new people, can gain support from the Youth Team in a safe and inclusive environment.

# Got Your Back

The Got Your Back group run by Relationships Australia Canberra and Region (RACR) offers a free safe space to young people aged 12 to 25 who have been impacted by family and domestic violence to receive support to deal with any issues they are facing.

# Teen Clinic

Teen Clinic is a free service that provides local teenagers with the opportunity to talk to one of our nurses about a range of issues in a non-judgmental environment. The nurses are there to help advise young people on both medical and non-medical issues allowing them to make educated, healthy choices.
