School board nominations have now concluded. Please congratulate out parent members: Cath Terrell and Alex Gundry. And our student member: Abbey Lawson.


#### Japanese News

Year 7 have had a great start to learning Japanese at Lanyon this year. We have looked at why we learn a language, where Japan is in the world and our link to Japan.

More recently year 7 have begun learning to introduce themselves in Japanese. This includes name, age, nationality and using appropriate greetings. Students have been encouraged to use Japanese regularly in the classroom, improving their confidence and pronunciation. They have also been introduced to Hiragana, learning to recognise and write each character.

In Year 8 Japanese students have been learning about daily routines and time. As part of this unit students have focussed on identifying and comparing parts of English and Japanese sentences and sentence structure. They have then applied this knowledge to create sentences and respond to questions such as what time do they eat breakfast? Or What time do they go to school?

In our study of time, we looked at reading the time in Japanese and how to read analogue clocks. In one of our activities, students were given a group of times, written in Japanese, to draw on the clock on the board.

In year 9 and 10 Japanese, students have been refining Japanese language learning skills through research in an inquiry task. In this task, our young people are accessing a range of written texts in Japanese and identifying new language (vocabulary and grammar) to investigate as an individual or in partnership with a classmate. Students are encouraged to search for Japanese language out in the wild and use these new words or grammatical features when producing new texts, either through written or through spoken created texts.

#### Talking with our school

Our teachers and school staff work hard every day to provide the best outcomes for every student.

Preparing for great teaching takes time. It is important that our teachers and school staff have time outside their core hours to rest and reset.

Communication with parents and carers is important to us and our staff will always work to get back to your enquiries within a reasonable timeframe. We aim to do this within 3 workings days. If your matter is urgent, we will get back to you as quickly as possible.

There is no expectation that teachers respond to queries from families during their personal and family time.

Every student and every family are important to us. By respecting the time of our teachers, you are helping to make time for great teaching.

We want to continue to work closely with you on your child's learning at school and do our best to respond to you in a timely manner.


We update families on what is happening at our school in a number of ways from information nights, emails, notes, newsletters, and social media. We encourage you to stay in touch with our school through these channels.
